Field Ministry Involvement (4 semesters)

Double Majors:

Students who wish to receive a double major may do so by meeting all of the course requirements for both majors. Within the CMI department, any course utilized by more than one program may be counted towards the requirements of those programs. However, at least 50% of the classes for a second major must be specific to that major. Practicum requirements must be met for each major.

Senior Seminar (IAS 493) must also be met for each major unless both are within the CMI department, in which case the student need only take it once.
